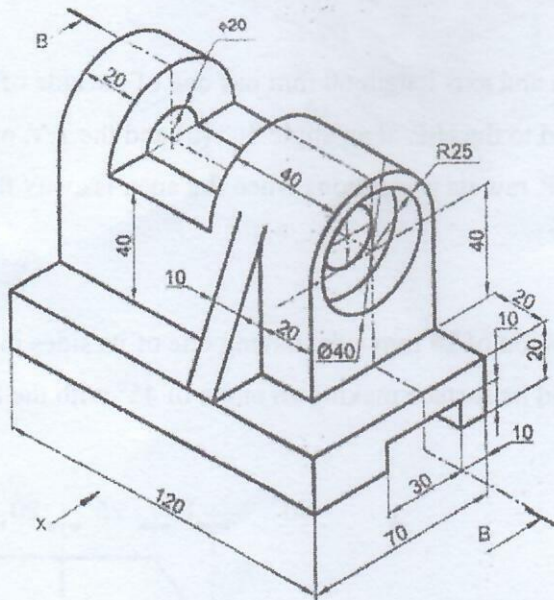
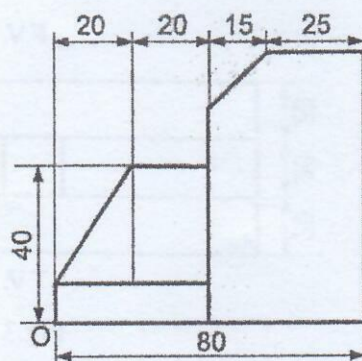

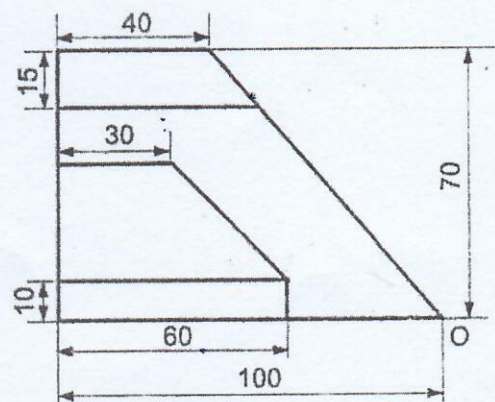
For the given pictorial view in figure fig1 Draw:

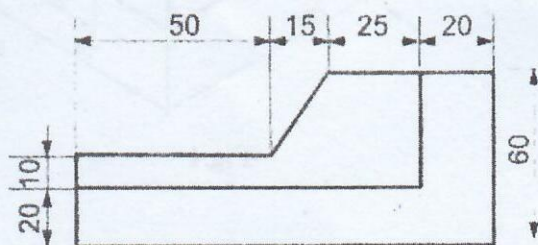

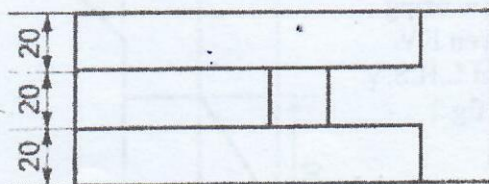
