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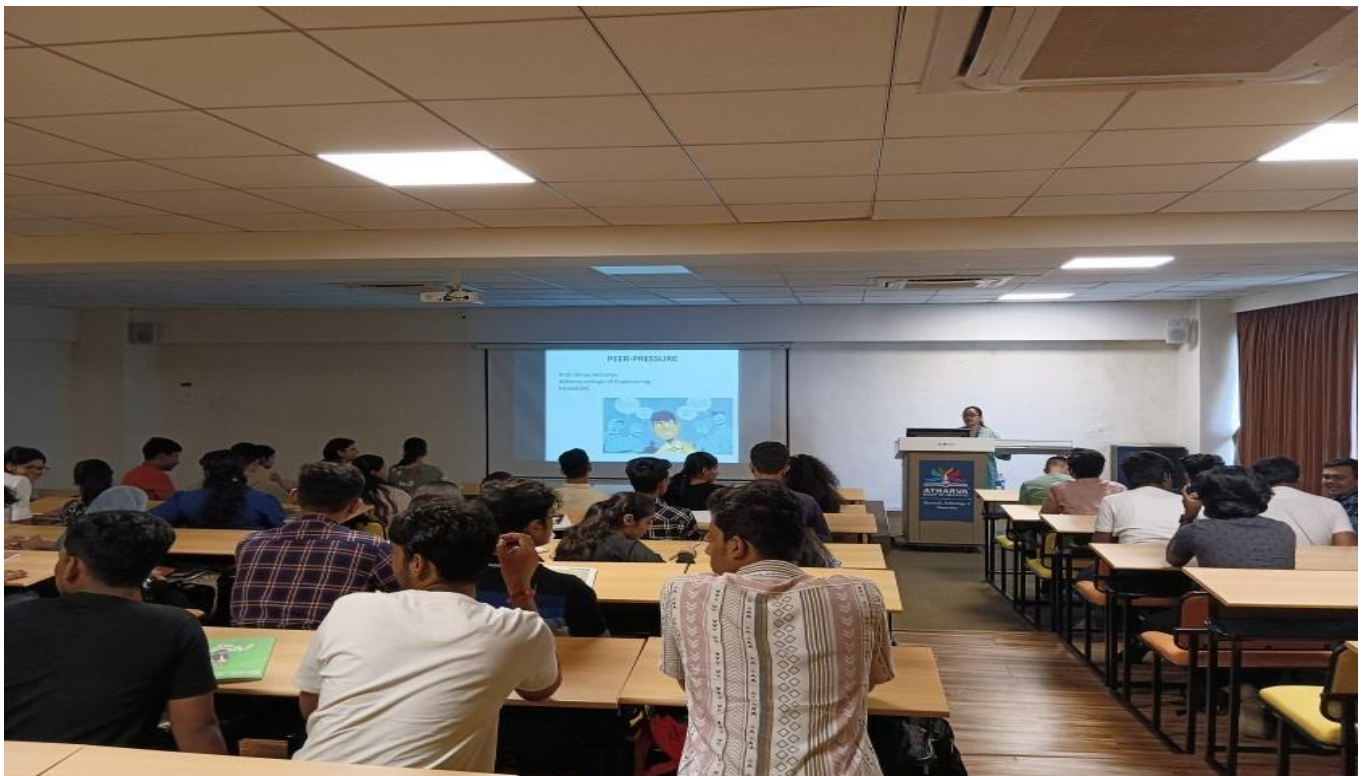
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### **F.E Induction Program on Peer Pressure**

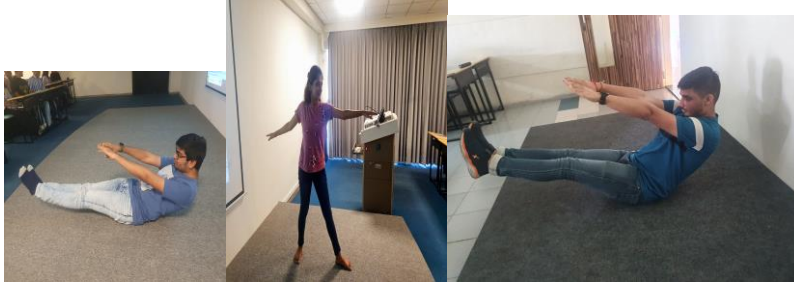
## Report on Topic of YOGA for the induction of First year students

Induction was held for first year students of ELEX, EXTC, ECS, CMPN branch on topic of YOGA on the date 10<sup>th</sup> of November and 11<sup>th</sup> November. Presented a ppt for students in which importance of yoga, definitions of yoga, kinds of Yoga, Eightfold paths of Yoga, Aspects of yoga were mentioned. The session began by seeking the blessings of the Almighty by chanting the Gayatri Mantra. Asanas starting with warming up and stretching were followed by a Padmasanas, Sukhasan, Tadasana, Bhujang Asana. Some Asanas done by students.

A few minutes of Yoga during the day can be a great way to get rid of stress that accumulates daily, in both, body and the mind. Yoga postures, Pranayama and meditation are effective a technique to release stress. Meditation is relaxation and rejuvenates the body and mind. Yoga is more than just a workout. It's actually a combination of 4 components,

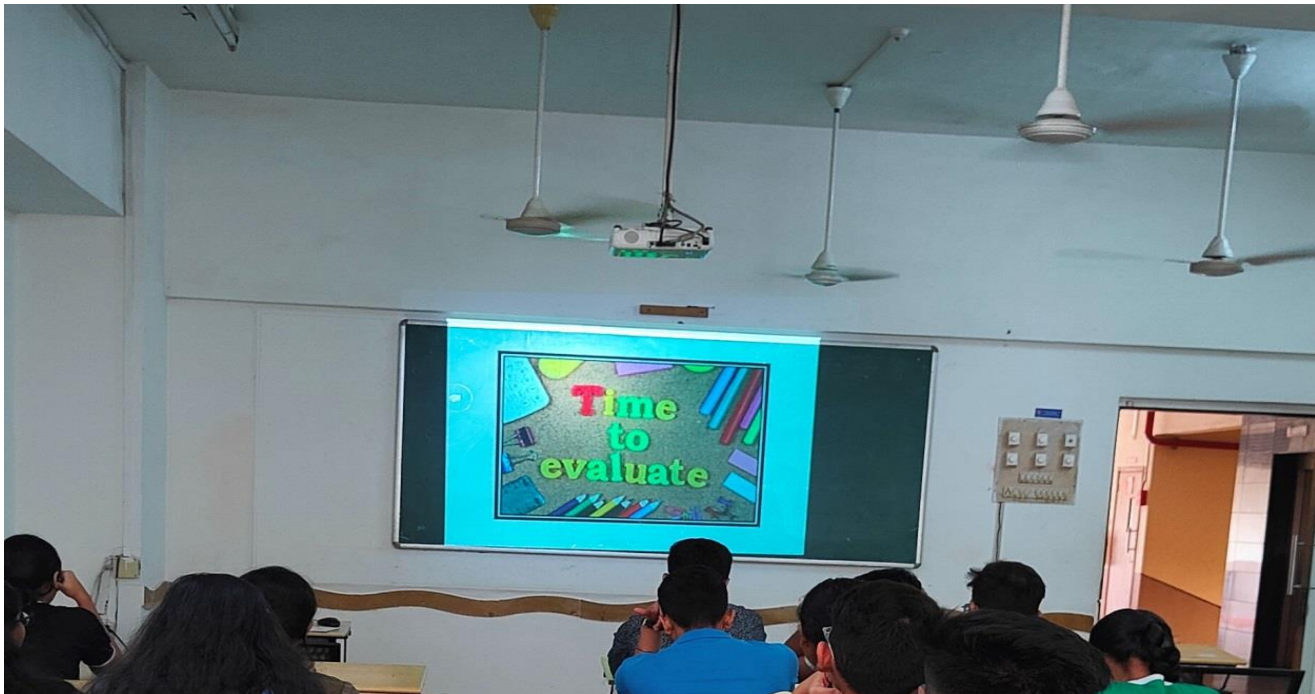

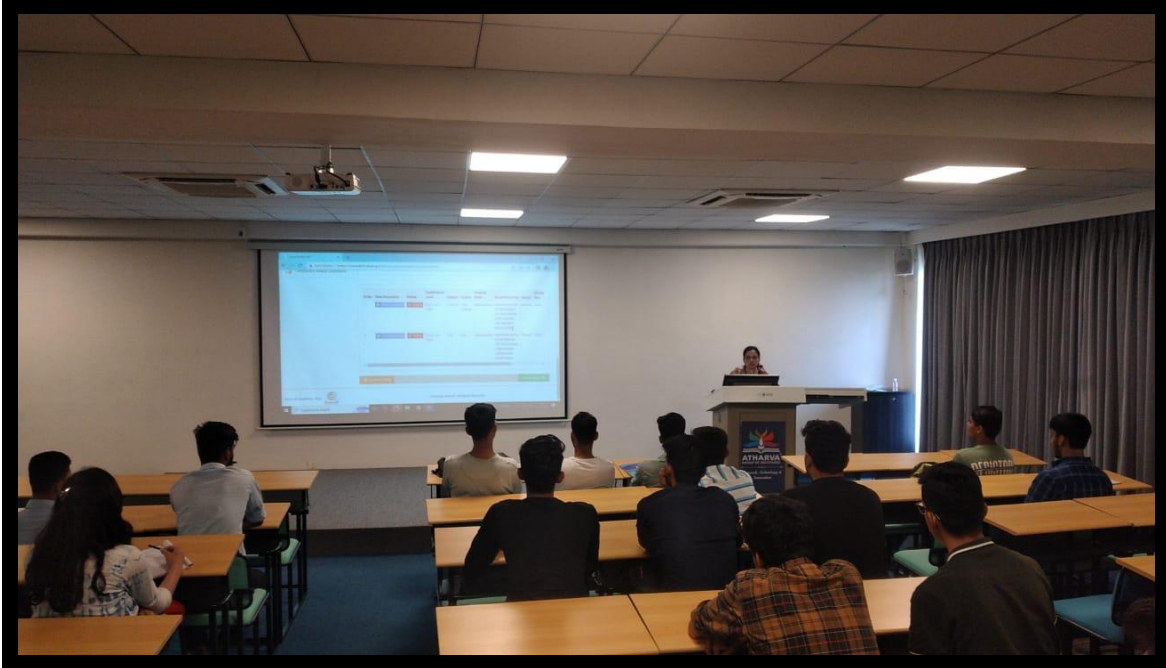

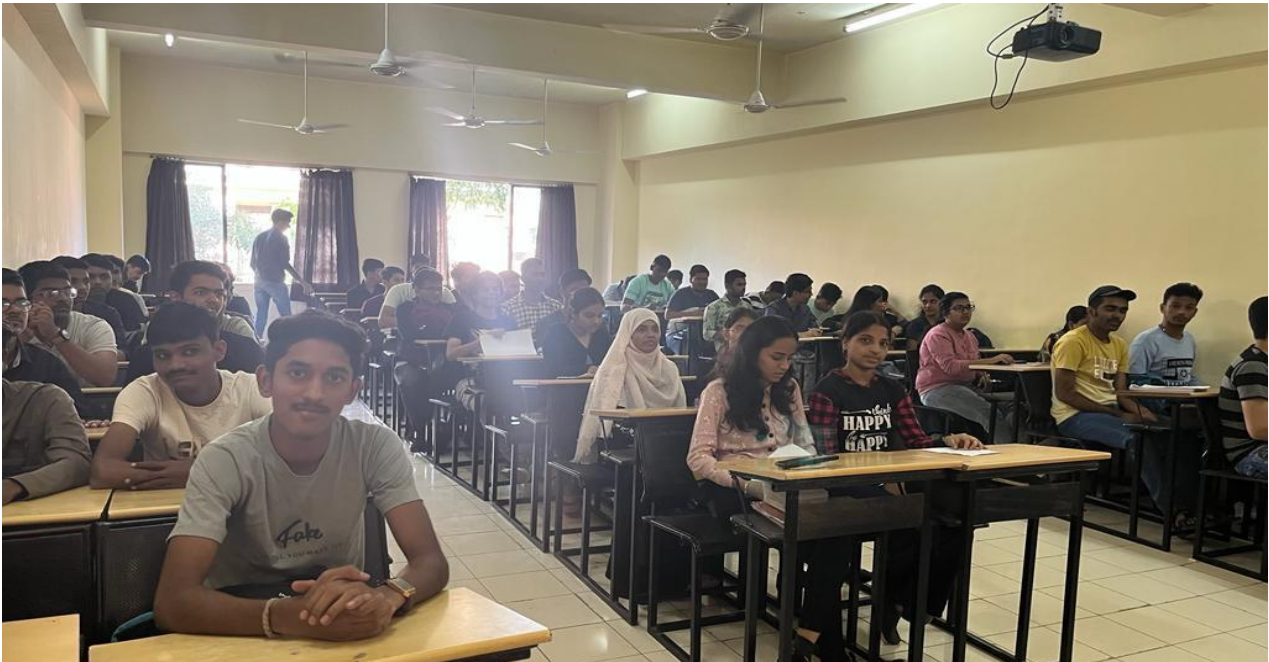
